Mia Westerlund Roosen * sculpture and drawings

"These pieces are about working two materials together. The primary structure is made of concrete. The shapes are simple forms handled in a specific manner emphasizing the density and entrapped energy of the material. The skin on the shapes acts in a paradoxical manner to give a sense of vulnerability and lightness. Therefore, the meaning of the pieces embodied in the manipulation of the material."
