Dear Mr. Abbott,

At the instance of Mr. Park and the members of the Art Division I am asking if you would be at all interested in coming to Bennington semetime during the next semester to talk at one of our evening meetings on some subject relating to art which you might suggest. I take special pleasure in doing this because I have wanted for a long time to meet you. President McConaughy of Wesleyan first told me about you when you were spending the year there and I have naturally had an interest in your work because of our having graduated from the same college.

Three evenings each week immediately after dinner we have what are called our evening meetings, the main purpose of which is to have speakers from outside the College present some of the more general or stimulating problems or points of view in the various fields in which the College does work. These talks are aimed at the general student body rather than at the students majoring in the field. The speaker's presentation lasts forty-five minutes after which there is half to three-quarters of an hour of questions, answers and discussion by the group who remain for that purpose. We have a stated honorarium of \$25 plus traveling expenses which is inadequate, of course, to secure or to pay adequately professional lecturers but it does at least provide the expenses of the speakers.

Will you let me know if you can come to us sometime during next semester? The best evenings for the purpose are Tuesday and Thursday and I should like to have you suggest a time between February 23 and June 28 which would be convenient for you.
