Mrs. McCamy will give a brief account of some of the salient aspects of Hopi culture.

After the job has been approved, she will receive written permission from the Director of Student Personnel and a duplicate of this permission will be sent to her prospective employer. If she does not then take the job, she should notify the Student Personnel office.

Groups wishing to engage in offcampus activities should make group application through their representative.
