Requests can be made at any time; however, in order for requests to be reviewed and determined prior to the start of the fall term, The Disability Accommodation Request Form and supporting documentation must be submitted to Laurie Kobik (Barn 123G or lkobik@bennington.edu) by June 1. Forms can be picked up in Barn 123G or printed from the College's website.

Requests made after the deadlines or during the term will be reviewed and determined as quickly as possible.

* Please note undergraduate housing assignments are for the full academic year; therefore, requests made after the June 1 deadline may be more difficult to fulfill.
