Tomorrow morning marks a moment in the history of Bennington College that no one saw coming a mere five weeks ago: the shift to remote education that Isabel Roche announced on March 13 will commence. There will surely be quite a few mistakes along the way too, on everyone's part. Since the shift to remote learning and teaching became a real possibility a few weeks ago, we have asked everyone to keep their expectations in check, for themselves and others. We need to be

generous and focus on what has always been our primary objective: facilitating the growth of each and every one of our students through meaningful and close interactions with faculty and staff. If you haven't seen this, please review the <u>revised syllabus</u> for a religious studies class at UNC Chapel Hill. It beautifully captures what we may occasionally need to remind ourselves in the coming weeks.

We will all need support, guidance, and understanding and it is more important than ever that we turn to one another, and that we communicate clearly and often.
