Staying local for FWT? Paid Internships available - applications due Oct. 11tth

As part of the College's three-year collaborative effort to address food insecurity in Bennington County funded by the Mellon Foundation, five paid internships are available for the winter Field Work Term: Southwestern Vermont Medical Center (1 position), Southwest Vermont Supervisory Union (2 positions), and Greater Bennington Interfaith Community Services (2 positions).

Field Work Term Funding

Students with high financial need (as determined by Financial Aid) received an email indicating automatic eligibility for a \$500 FWT grant if they register an unpaid FWT internship. Students who are not automatically eligible may still apply for a need-based FWT grant of up to \$500 via a simple grant application, which will be reviewed following receipt of their FWT registration. Both the grant application and FWT registration are due on November 8. (As explained here, students who secure paid internships will not be eligible for grants.)
