

Report of Recreation Council Meeting - May 14, 1940.

At the Recreation Council Meeting of May 14th, Charlotte Watson, the student treasurer, reported the results of her investigation concerning the sale of activities tickets. She found that the original purpose of the tickets, along with the admission fees for those who did not buy tickets, was to pay off the deficit incurred after the spring formal dance last year. Normally there would be no charge for these functions because the college supplies the council with funds for entertainments.

The administration has advised the council to discontinue the sale of activities tickets for two reasons, 1) They feel that there is no need for the money from the tickets since the deficit has been paid and since the activities should be free to the community. 2) It is against the policy of the college to create added expenses for the students.

Some of the members of the council still feel that there is a necessity for the the ticket money to hold as a reserve for future deficits. This brought up the question of the reason for a deficit. The opinion was that, as a rule, the spring dance is not successful from the financial point of view. It was suggested that the council wait until after the dance to decide whether to continue the spring formal dances hereafter.

No agreement was reached concerning the sale of tickets and the council decided to wait and decide the matter after the dance-- and if there is a deficit this year either to continue the sale of tickets next fall or to think of another way to pay of the deficit.
