LECTURE ON BAVARIAN BAROQUE

On Monday, April 28th, at 7:40 p.m. in Barn #1, Professor S. Lane Faison, Jr. Chairman of the Art Department and Director of Lawrence Art Museum at Williams College, will give an illustrated lecture on Bavarian Baroque.

Professor Faison taught art history at Yale from 1932 to 1936, and since at Williams. He was a Lt. Commander in the Navy during World War II and in 1945-46 was attached to the Art Looting Investigation Unit of the O.S.S. He interrogated Nazi art personnel in Austria and Germany, and wrote official reports on the formation of the Hitler art collection. In the Fall of 1950 he was on leave of absence from Williams working for the State Dept. in Munich to complete identification and return to proper owners of works of art collected for Hitler. Of the 27,000 works found in the Austrian salt mines, all but 950 were satisfactorily identified. During weekends and holidays he managed to visit most of the important examples of Bavarian Baroque.

Professor Faison is President of the College Art Association for 1952-53, and art critic (monthly column) for the NATION.
