A full performance of one of Handel's major oratories, <u>Israel in Egypt</u>, will be presented this Sunday evening, June 2, at 8:00 p.m., in the auditorium of the Mount Anthony Union High School in Bennington. This will be the final event of Mayfest 1968, a series of musical and dramatic productions to celebrate the fact that the community at long last has a full-fledged flexible auditorium that can seat a sizeable audience.

Faul Boepple, who taught at Bennington from 1944 to 1964, will be the conductor Sunday night. Some 200 individuals are participating as members of the community chorus and of the community orchestra, a full one that includes both organ and harpsichord. Numerous Bennington College students and faculty members are participating in this ambitious undertaking, as well as several members of the Dessoff Choirs of New York, which Mr. Beopple conducted from 1936 until this past winter. The five vocal soloists are professional musicians from New York and from the Westminister Music College in Princeton, N. J.
