Diplomas

For some time correspondence was carried on with various engraving firms regarding a diploma.

The final arrangement made was to have the diplomas printed by Mr. Smith and the students in his printing class, on the College printing press. A copy of the diploma used may be found in Mr. Leigh's file.

150 sheets, 17 x 22, of Crane's Parchment Deed #44 was purchased from John F. Sarle Co., Inc., 50 Hudson St., N. Y. There were some sheets left over which can be used another year. (They are probably in the printing room)

The students also made envelopes of Crane's Parchment Deed to put the diplomas in. Those seniors who wished to have leather covers ordered them through the College Store. About five were ordered. 60 sheets of tissue were ordered from Ward's, 57 Franklin St., Boston, Mass.

For the exact spelling of names on the diplomas, mimeographed blanks were sent to seniors and returned.
