Julia Sanches is the author of more than a dozen translations from Spanish, Portuguese, and Catalan into English. Her translations and writing have appeared in Granta, LitHub, Poets & Writers, and The Common, among others. She has received support for her work from the PEN Heim grant, PEN Translates, and the New York State Council of the Arts, and been longlisted and/or won the PEN Translation Award, the National Translation Award, and the Dublin International Literary Award. Born in Brazil, Julia now lives in Providence, Rhode Island.

Claudia Hernández, one of El Salvador's most acclaimed contemporary writers, has published five short-story collections and two novels, of which the latest is Slash and Burn. For her body of work, much of which focuses on the brutal impact of her country's Civil War, she was awarded the 2004 Anna Seghers Prize, which acknowledges authors trying to make a more just and humane world through their artistic production. Her books have appeared in Spain, Italy, France, Germany, and Israel.
