Dr. Dodd is a distinguished sociologist who has been teaching for some years in the American University of Beirut, Syria. In 1934 he published a report entitled "A Controlled Experiment in Rural Hygiene in Syria." He has just completed work on a book in collaboration with Mr. Lundberg, which will be published in the near future.

Dr. Dodd was in Syria last year while the fighting was going on, until the American University was closed. He can speak with authority about developments in the Near East. He has just arrived in this country after a very round-about trip via India, Capetown and Trinidad.

All proposed changes in Trial Major, or changes of Counselor without change of Trial Major, must be approved by the Director of Student Personnel.

Committee on Student Personnel, whose office is #31 in the Barn. It is the student's responsibility to secure the proper blank, fill it out, have it signed by the faculty members involved and return it to Miss Johnson's office as soon as possible.

From The College Post-Office

Starting Wednesday morning, October 8th, the Post Office in the Commons Store will have for sale Defense Postal Saving Stamps and Bonds. There are five Defense Postal Savings Stamps 10¢, 25¢, 50¢, \$1.00 and \$5.00. With the purchase of each kind of stamp, excepting the 10¢ stamps, you will receive, free of charge, for mounting that particular kind of stamp, a Defense Stamp Album. When filled with the proper Defense Postal Stamps, the different albums will have a cash value in exchange for Defense Savings Bonds as follows:

25¢ Stamp Album containing 75 Defense Stamps, has total value \$18.75, buys a Defense Savings Bond, worth in 10 years \$25.00.

50¢ Stamp Album containing 75 Defense Stamps, has total value \$37.50, buys a Defense Savings Bond, worth in 10 years \$50.00.

\$1.00 Stamp Album containing 75 Defense Stamps, has total value \$75.00, buys a Defense Savings Bond, worth in 10 years \$100.00.

\$5.00 Stamp Album containing 15 Defense Stamps, has total value \$75.00, buys a Defense Savings Bond, worth in 10 years \$100.00.

Also starting this Wednesday, the wire basket which has been on one of the Post Office counters for use of memos and notices for later distribution by the Postmistress will be removed, and thereafter all memos and notices will be placed directly in the Post Office boxes by members of the Community.
