Field Work Term Funding

Students with high financial need (as determined by Financial Aid) received an email indicating automatic eligibility for a \$500 FWT grant if they register an unpaid FWT internship. Students who are not automatically eligible may still apply for a need-based FWT grant of up to \$500 via a simple grant application, which will be reviewed following receipt of their FWT registration. Both the grant application and FWT registration are due on November 8. (As explained here, students who secure paid internships will not be eligible for grants.)
