Dance Committee

The fee covers transportation for himself and his orchestra as well as teaching and calling the dances. Representatives of the Recreation Council will bring the matter up in House meetings. Susan Bailey suggested that the Recreation Council hold a student-taught practice dance.

Athletic Committee

Drama: Miss Shelly obtained the permission of the Recreation Council to use the Carriage Barn for the Spring production of the Dmama-Dance-Design division. The rehearsal schedule has been planned so that it will not interfere with the use of the Carriage Barn for recreational activities. The schedules will be posted.
