Research

The foundation of Crossett Library's research services is to provide highly personalized service focused on the individual needs of faculty and students. The library offers a variety of information resources and services relevant to the ongoing and evolving curriculum. A variety of instructional services are available including individual consultations with librarians, library instruction sessions for a class, librarian visits to classes, library tours, online research guides, and more.

Library Instruction

There were 870 reference interactions.

Joe Tucker, research services librarian, taught 16 library instruction sessions scheduled within courses. The sessions were attended by 178 students.

The average of students' evaluations of the sessions rating instructor effectiveness, overall value, and perceived relevance was 4.78 on a scale of 1 to 5 with 5 as the highest rating.



CAPA Embedded Librarian

This year Crossett Library began a pilot embedded librarian program. The model of the embedded librarian works well with the CAPA curriculum because of the collaborative approach and the necessity for timely, accurate information. Jared Della Rocca, technology resources and outreach librarian, worked with two CAPA classes. He provided research and further reading suggestions within class discussion, as well as meeting individually with students planning their term-long projects. He corresponded with students to check their progress and assist with any research problems they encountered. The students developed a familiarity with a librarian which put them more at ease when requiring assistance outside of the classroom. Between the two classes, Jared had 22 research meetings in the library, answered 37 reference questions via e-mail providing 55 different resources, and during discussion in-class and on the class Facebook page answered 52 queries and shared 110 resources.

Crossett Library owns approximately 183,000 books in print and electronic format and 6,000 movies. Over 3,000 items were added to the collection this year.

Collection

The library's collection of information resources is not viewed as a static body but rather as an organic and vital extension of the educational experience. The collection is carefully curated in collaboration with the community to maximize relevance and use.

This year we received 920 requests (516 faculty members, 404 students) representing 50 percent of all purchased book and film acquisitions for the year.

A three-year project led by Collection Services Librarian Vanessa Haverkoch, inventorying almost 100,000 items in the collection has concluded this year. The loss rate of 1.5 percent was lower than expected, particularly because the collection had not been inventoried in over a decade. Incorrectly shelved items identified in the inventory were shelved correctly and over 200 titles were ordered as replacements for lost copies.

Donations to the Collection

This year the Library received 1,013 donations which accounted for 32 percent of all items added to the collection. Donations often allow the library to add depth to specific areas or obtain works which would otherwise be unaffordable. Two notable examples from this year are books from the estate of Carolyn Crossett Rowland '37 with particular focus in visual arts and the works of Thomas Mann, and the donation by Bruce and Suzie Kovner of a limited edition Pennyroyal Caxton Bible designed and illustrated by Barry Moser.



Crossett Library is committed to engaging technology to enhance services and collections, approaching technology as a tool rather than a solution. An open attitude to emerging digital opportunities, in combination with a responsive College community willing to use new features, allows the library to adopt the best solutions.

A new chat box was added to the main page of the library website. The initial launch was positively received and this year there were approximately 150 chat sessions. The questions varied from quick informational inquiries to more in-depth questions about research projects. Due to the success of the pilot the library has decided to retain the feature on the library's front page.

The library server was upgraded increasing the memory capacity and providing more secure backups.

Social Media

Crossett Library's Tumblr page has added almost 150 new followers and received 4,000 visits from non-followers. A new Facebook page has received over 200 "likes" since January 2013 and has reached almost 75,000 people through friends of fans of the page. The library's Twitter account has over 400 followers and Pinterest has 200. The library's collection of 3,000 photographs on Flickr receives an average of 250 views a day.

People entered Crossett Library 97,000 times this past year. The library is open 102 hours a week. There is an all-night study room which remains open after the rest of the library is closed.

Access

The library actively pursues ways of expanding access and integrating library services and resources into the life of the College; activities include faculty-suggested reading lists, displays related to campus programs or lectures, film screenings, and student-created events and displays.

In her role as public services coordinator, Laura Payne oversees the scheduling and daily activities crucial to maintaining Crossett Library's philosophy of accessibility.

Crossett Library holds several celebrations every year such as World Book Day. The day originated in Catalonia on St. George's Day, where the tradition of exchanging a flower for a book began. This year Crossett's celebration included giving out flowers, food, raffles, photo ops with Shakespeare, and live fiddle music.

Crossett Library circulated more than 35,000 items this year. The library's approximately 50 databases provide access to more than 47,000 journals and newspapers.

Resources

One of the library's most fundamental roles is to provide access to resources. There is no reference collection of books; almost all books circulate as do journals and newspapers. Extended loan periods are easily arranged with the library staff and borrowing over the Field Work Term and summer is encouraged.

Crossett Library provides access to approximately 50 databases in a range of subjects covering all the disciplines taught at Bennington College. Offcampus access to the vast majority of our databases is available to all current students and members of the faculty and staff. The databases were searched more than 50,000 times this year.



Interlibrary Loan Kathy Williams, interlibrary loan coordinator, helps Crossett expand access to resources for faculty members and students by borrowing from thousands of other libraries around the world. This year students and faculty members received 1,128 articles requested through interlibrary loan as well as 1,450 books, CDs, and films. Crossett Library also contributed to the reciprocal spirit of interlibrary loan by loaning almost 1,100 of our items to other libraries.

Opportunities

The Faculty Library Fellowship is a competitively awarded fellowship that provides one faculty member per year with a course release in order to develop a new course incorporating the resources and services of Crossett Library. The purpose of the fellowship is to enable the development of courses that integrate the opportunities offered by the library into course work in a significant way.

There are many possibilities, but two specific outcomes are intended: first that the students develop a sophisticated understanding of the purpose and use of a library; and second that students create projects and dialogues to both highlight and expand the role of Crossett Library within the Bennington College community.

Ann Pibal, a member of the visual arts faculty, was this year's recipient. Ann's proposal centers on bringing students' awareness to primary documents of art history and contemporary art criticism.



Student Library Research Grant

Crossett Library announced a new student research grant this year to support students traveling to a library or archive in order to use a specific research collection. The grant funds the reimbursement of travel, meals, and miscellaneous expenses associated with the research. Walker Mimms, a third-year student studying literature, was the recipient. Walker used the grant to travel to Columbia University's Butler Library for his research on James Boswell's *Life of Samuel Johnson* and Edward Gibbon's *History of the Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire*.

The Jennings Music Library has more than 10,000 scores, 2,500 music CDs, and 2,000 LPs.

Jennings Music Library

The Music Library holds approximately 18,000 items which include scores, CDs, LPs, books, reference volumes, films, and periodicals. The collection's emphasis is on classical, jazz improvisation, 20th- and 21stcentury music, and world music. The library contains numerous works of former and current faculty composers and recordings of students' concerts. Susan Reiss, head of the music library, creates a welcoming space and useful collection for students and faculty members.

This year music scores circulated more than 1,000 times and music CDs were checked out 528 times. Faculty members and students made 56 purchasing requests, which accounts for 61 percent of all purchased items.

Based on faculty and student feedback a major LP cataloging project was completed this year making the LPs easily searchable in the library's online catalog. "The Jennings Music Library can be deceptively quiet for a place that facilitates so much sound, but it is always a calm and warmly welcoming place for students of every discipline at Bennington."


