AIDS HOTLINE

One of the most authoritative sources of information on the AIDS epidemic available is a toll-free national hotline manned by volunteers at St. Clare's Hospital and Health Center in New York City. The hotline operates from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. weekdays and 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays and offers expert advice on everything from drugs and AIDS to testing, and from emotional support and symptoms to sexual practice—all on an anonymous basis. HEALTH SERVICE HOURS

The Health Service is open daily from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (3 p.m. to 11 p.m. on weekends), with a nurse on duty. In the event of an emergency when the Health Service is closed, call the emergency extension 210. A college physician is available Monday through Friday for clinic hours. Check with the Health Service for the exact hours.

Doctor appointments should be arranged either through the nurse on duty or the Health Service secretary. If you are unable to keep an appointment, call the Health Service or leave a note on the door. Students who miss a doctor's appointment without prior notice will be charged \$10 for that missed appointment.

Students who need to be seen by a doctor when the Health Service physician is not in attendance should contact the nurse on duty during Infirmary hours or call the emergency ext. 210 when the Health Service is closed. A trip to the Emergency Room without prior approval may not be covered by school insurance.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING SERVICE

Psychological Counseling is available to all students in need of help in crisis situations or for longer term problems. Confidentiality is maintained. The first four visits are <u>free</u> for <u>all</u> students. Fees for extended counseling sessions are obtained from student and/or private insurance reimbursement when available.
