Minutes of October 21, 1940

The meeting was brought to order with the chairman, Katrina Van Tassel presiding. Members of the staff present were Betty Kane, Frances Berna, and Lucile Bloch. Nancy Mirose as representative of the College Week also attended. The faculty advisers were Miss Osgood, Mr. Belitt, Mr. Bradford Smith, Miss Grimwood, and later, Mr. Kouwehhoven. Absent: Mr. Chause Janett.

There was first a discussion of a notice for the College Week asking for material for the magazine. Frances Berna explained the lay out and s owed a working of the cover. Mr. Charles Smith could not be present. The problem of material was discussed, Mr. Belitt suggesting that a publicity campaign be held as a means of contacting the students and of making them aware of the work in hand. It was suggested that there be a planned campaign with posters and notices in the Commons. Mis Grimwood asked about illustrations and explained the type of photography needed. The questions of graduate and faculty inclusion in the magazine was talked over. It was decided that there might be one example of each type of work per issue. Mr. Kouwenhoven explained that the staff might rely on the faculty for help in presenting material.

After the faculty Teft, the board decided to place contribution boxes in the Commons, and to start house-to-house canvassing, and the meeting was adjourned till the next day.
