"Panic Attack"

Protest art collective, Pussy Riot, has released their latest music video for their single, "Panic Attack," which features the work of awardwinning augmented reality creator, Asad J. Malik '19. The music video was also listed for sale inside of four limited-edition Non-Fungible Tokens (NFTs). Malik's hologram production company, Jadu, took charge of the production of the video, meant to be an immersive augmented reality experience about what it's like to have a panic attack. Malik was named one of the Top 10 Filmmakers to Watch by The Independent in 2018, and most recently featured on Forbes' 30-Under-30 in Marketing & Advertising.
