Preamble
We, the members of the Bennington Collcge commanty, jointly seek
to pronote the exercise of incivicual responsibility
to moderate conflict between the organs of government
to provide forums for the discussion of affairs affecting
all monvers of the community
to clarify the locus of lesislative authority
to insure continuity in the govemance of the commanty.
Undec the lans of the State of Vermont and under the charter of the Bemington College Coxporation, we thecefore establish this constitution.

Article I. House Government is Student Representatives
81. The nembers of each house shall elect a House Chairperson and an Assistent House Chairperson, or two Co-Cheirpersons at the end of each senester, to serve for a perjod of one senester. No first tem ireshman or twansfer stuaent shall be eligible to serve as a Chajrpexson.
§2. It shall be the responsibility of the Houso Chairperson, or CoChairpersons, to execute the regulations and conduct the business of the house, employing those measuros that moy be neoessory and proper to fullefill the responsibilities put forth in this Constitution. Chairpersons on Co-Chairpersons of collegemomed houses shall serve on Student Council. Dach of these houses shall have one vote on Student Council, whether they have one Chairperson or two. The Chairperson shall onforce legilacion that has been passed by the house meeting, by the Student Govemment, or by the Communtyo When enforcemont proves impossible, the Ghairperson shall report offenses to the Student Council. Chairpersons shall de exempt from the finencial obligations of the house, except as menbersthereor.
§3. Each house shall hold froquent moetings of all its members in order: (a) To legisjate on house business, such as quiet hours, and pets in the house\%*;
(b) To deliberate and vote on matters of college policy whenever requested by Student Council, or members of the house;
(c) To orient new students each term. Trs' Questions reforred to house mectings for discussion by a proper authority shall be uilscussed within two neeks.

840 Representatives for students living off campus shall be chosen in a manor to be determined by Student Council, providing that an effort is made to insure equal representation on Student Council. with the othor houses.

[^0]§5. Off-campus representatives shall be elocted in the first two weeks of each term. These ropresentatives shall serve until elections are nold in the following tern. They shall be responsible for seeing that propor deliboration and voting takes place in the constituency they represent, and shall serve on Student Council.

Article II. Student Government \& Electorate
§1. Individual participation being essential to effective selfgovernment,
(a) Every student member of the community shall have the right of suffrage on every matter that is presented for a vote, and $15 \%$ of those elibible voters present at any election or balloting shall have the right to demand that voting take place by secret ballot if not already required [by the Constitution];
(b) AII members of the student community shall have the right to nominate conadidates for elective oufice, provided that they observe the provisions of the Constitution in offering such nominations;
(c) Buery member of the student commanity shall have the right to potition the Stucient Council in any mattor of college policy; and if students numbering $15 \%$ of the electorate shall petition the Stwant Council in support of specific legislation, the Stuacnt Council must refer the matter (with or without recomendation) to a vote in the house neetings;
(d) Kembers of the student community shall have the right to recall officials elected or appointed by students. A recall election shail be held when $15 \%$ of the appropxiate constituoncy has petittoned for it, and an ofictal shall be removed. Eron office whenever a majority of those voting in a recall election or one-third of the elighble voters (whichever is larger) shall have voted for their teonli
(e) $15 \%$ of the student electorate may petition for a student or Community Heeting;
(f) Any election or balloting where less than $25 \%$ of the student electorate cast their vote shall be delcared invalid。
§2. The President of Student Council will be elected by the Student body at large. The Prestcent shall presjae over Student Council, and Student and Commaity Mestings provided for in this Constitution, shall be responsibic for preparing the agenda for Student Council, and shall be responsible for secing that motions passed by Student Council are carried into effect. Only students who have served at
82. (continued) least one term on Student Council shall be eligible for the office of President. The President shall not concurrently hold the pocition of Student Council. Representative. The Vicepresident shall be eloctad by tho student cody at large from the current mombers of Stuciont Council, and shall hold both positions concurrontly. In the absence of the President, the Vice-ixesident shall assume the duties of the president, until such time as the President returns, or new elections can be held. The President and Vice--Presidient shall be elected at the beginning of each term and shall scrve for one semester, until elections are held the following texm. Student Council shall elect a Treasurer and a Seccetary, and the Student Educational Policies Comittee shall appoint a Secretary. The Treasurer and the Secretaries shall be paid from Student Council funds.
§3. There shall be a Student Council, composed of Chairpersons of the houses, plus the off-campus representatives. It shall be the responsibility of Student Council:
(a) To inquire into and deliberate upon matters of student or College policy arising Within the Council or presented to it for consideration by other agencies;
(b) To provide for expenditure of Recreation and Special Events funds:
(c) To establish housing regulations, run room drawings, and hear appeals on housing dectsions;
(d) To conduot election and rererenduns and publicioe the results;
(e) To plan the orientation of new students, in concurronce with the Director of Admissions;
(f) To conduct such other business of the Student Rlectorate as it deems necessary and proper.
§4. In addition, the authority of Student Councjl shall extend to all infractions of rules by students, and to Constitutional matters solely concemins students or Student Govormment. It shall insure that provisions of this Constitution are observed by the Student Body, its Officers and Representatives. It shall have the power to employ such penalties as it deens appropatate, up to and including the power to suspend or expel students.
§5. Every student shall have the right to appeal to the President of the College to reduce a penalty imposed by Student Council. Sentences of suspenstion or expulsion must be appealed to the President of the College.
§6. Student Council shall hold meetings at least once every two weekso All meetings will be open. Student Council may refer matters of special importance, or there gencral student opinion is dosired, With or without recommendation, to the Student body. It may call for discussion of such natters in House Meetings or at a Student or Communty lleeting.
Student Council shall execute the regulations and conduct the business
§7. (contimed) and shall also consult with faculty mombers of their divisions whenever the expression of student opinion is sought. The divisional reprocentatives shall shal ano : Ahaty ad thouss troolass reprosontatives' roportis, bringing any general suggesitions that onerge to the attontion of the faculty, then sending these reports on to the President. The divisional representatives shall meet as a conmittee of the whole to discuss questions of educational policy being considered by the Faculty and/or Trustee Educational Policies Committees when its opinions as representative of the student body is sought.**
§8. The Jon Resident Term Comittee: There shall be a Non Resident term Comittee composed of one representative of each of the sophomore, junior, and senior classes, three nembers of the teaching taculty, the Director of the Non Resident Term Office, and the Dean of Studies, ex officio. One freshman shall be elected by vote of the student body every year at the end of the spang tem and shall be a candidate for reelection cach following year until she or he graduates, but all other candidates may be nominated by the student body at its discretion and according to the nonination procedures appiying to student rembers [of the Commanity]. At the same time one faculty member shall be elocted in a preferential secret ballot of the faculty to serve for $a$ tem of three years.t
The Comnittee as a whole shall elcot a faculty Chairperson at the first meeting in the fall tem. This farst meeting shall be called by the Drrector of the Fon Restient Tom Office and shall be held during the ficst month of the fall term. The Committee shall stand in the same relationship to the Non Resident Term Office as the faculty and student Educational Folicies Comittees do to the Dean of Studies.
The Commttee Will serve the Dinector of the Non Resident Term Office in the capacity of a consultative body. The student, faculty, and administrative mombors of the Committee shall serve as liasons to their respective constituencies, and a remresentative must be present irom each constituency for the Commitee to trancact business.

Article IV The Administration
§1. For the purposes of this constitution, the menvers of the administration shall be designated by the president of the college.
§2. The administration cxercises the authority necessary to carry out its policios adopted by constitutional authority where their execution is not otherwise provided for.
§3. The President has the authority to recommend to the Trustees the appointment and reappointmont of monvers of the faculty and acministration, observing such recomendations as they ray be adopted by the faculty aftecting the nature of the advice that is to be enployed in reviewing appointments

[^1]84. The President has authority to recommol to the irusteos changes in the jolicios of the college on his or initiative or upon formal recommondation of the facult or the commanty.
85. Nothing in this constitution shall abricijo the authority of the President to act in all mattors in which he or she is legally responsiblefor, or accountable to the trustees for, the conduct of the college. Nevertheless, in cases in which the President finds it necossary to contravene legislation adopted by the community or one of its constituencies, he or she shall report the action both to tho appropriate body of the community government and to the Trustees, and shall transmit to the Trustees any memoranda prepared for their consideration by the commuity or one of its constituencies.

## V. Community Government

81. The Bennington College Community consists of the student body, the faculty, and the mombers of the administration and staff.
§2. The Bennington College Conmunty will nomally meet in separate constituencies to deliberate upon matters of collese policy, but nothing in this constitution shall be held to preciude a general meeting of the whole community on natters of enenal concern. The Comunity shall meet as a single group upon the call of the President, the Faculty Educational Policies Committee, or the Student Council: upon petition of $15 \%$ of the commanity to the Student Council, or when two constituencies have adopted divergent policies. In all cases, Commanity Heetings shall be presided over by the President of the Student Council or the President's delogated representative.
§3. Amendment of Article III. may be proposed by any standing comittee of the faculty, by a majoxity vote of the nembers of an academic division (by vote of one of the seven academic divisions) or by petition of one-fourth of the voting members of the faculty. An amendment shall be adopted when approved by a majority of those voting in a faculty neeting.
§4. AII voting on matters of commaity concern shall take place in the separate constituencies, as provided for in this constitution.
§5. In all cases in which the interpretation of the constitution is in dispute, and in all cases where two or nore competent constituencies disagree upon a policy affecting both or in which one constituency asserts a clajm to competence that is disputed by another, the difference of opinion shall be referred to a Constitutional Council, to be composed of three members of the administration other than the President, three mombers of the teaching faculty, and three students chosen by preferential ballot of the student body from candidates nominated by a student.
No nember of the administration or faculty shall be eligible for
82. (contimued) the Constitutional Council until he ox she has been a membor of the foculty for tro yoars. No student shall be eligible for the Constitutional Council until he or she has served at least one toxn on istudent Cownch or the Student Educational Policies Comitice. The Constitutional Council shall be a standing committee, presided over by one of its mombers. Its menbers shall be elected for one and one-half years, one nember from cach constituency being chosen cach texm. A majority vote of the Council shall be binding on all partics to a dispute, provided that no decision of this Council may abridge Article IV. 85 or this constitution. The Council shall publish its decisions when made, assigning reasons therefor, and shall publish both majocity and minority opinions when it fails to reach a unonimous decision.

## Article VI. Amendment

§1. Amendment of Articles $V$ and $V$ may be proposed by one quarter of the student body, the Student Council, the faculty meeting, or the nembers of the administration, and shall be adopted when approved by a majority of those students voting and a majority of student housea, a majority of the faculty, and a majority of the administration.
§2. No amendnent of this constitution may be voted upon until after a pertod of two weeks following the formal proposel of the amendment and Lts circulation to all nembers of the college commantity by the Secretary of the college.

## Article VII, Ratification

81. This constitution shall be adoptod when it has been approved by a majority of the students and a majority of the faculty voting in a referendurn to be concuctod by the present executive comittoe, provided that the total number of voters in each constituency is greater than $50 \%$ oi the alirible voters.
§2. When this constitution has been adopted, officers of the present community government shall conduct necessary elections and make such other armangements as may be necessary to jnsure an ordorly transier of authority, provided that nembers of standing comittees established under the prosent community covernment whose terms have not expirod sholl be chtitled to continue in office for no longer than one semester. For the first student diection under this consitution Glicibility requirements shall be detemined by the present exccutive comnittce on the basis of past experience.
§3. Rules and regulations of the present community govermment shall remain in effect until chenged by properly establishod constitutional authority.

At the behest of the prosident of Btubut Counch, or at the request of the fousing Comittee, a Judiciacy Comittee nill be chonen by Student Council in the following manes.

a) Nominadions will be made by members of Stanent Councin and can be for any member of the Stucent pody juased not eirectly involved in the case to be cecicod. There disputes arise as to the selection of perticulaz inoividuals, each case noll be discussed and voted upon by Student Courcti, a strope majority necossary for excluston. howover, exclusion for ary other reason than the one mortioned above, ive comelict of interest, may de overruled by the Fresjdent of Student Council and the indiviousl seated on the comnttee.
b) The only stipulation in selecting menbers is as follome: Tive (5) individuels will be selected wito the rovioton that fone vo. Wad at least one mabour be cran from shacht Guncta.
c) The Frosident of Student Council nill aitont nsetine ex-adeicio

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Furthermore, in Jine with traditional legal proceedings, a student rought before the commttee is enttiled to choice of counsel to reyrosent his or her defense. Althourh Judiciawy ennittoo rastes wid éversot un avtreery broceedinss, that is, rith a plaintifi and a defendant, the commttee shall be responsible for determining the facts of the case and will therefore have tho power to call individuals before the committee to testify about the case in question. It uill be the duty of the comittee to resolve disputes as quichly and emicably to both parties as is possible The function. of the committee is therefoce to minimize disputes end met to act in a vindictive fashion. fever shall the Judiciary Committee have the power to pursue cases on its own intiative. After the resolution ol each case or set of cases, the current Judiciary Committee will itstand. Seloction of a new connittee will be in accorcance rith procedures deseribed above. A voting member of the judiciary moy not serve two consecutive toms.
