Summer Storage

The Student Life team has spent the past month looking into campus-wide storage options. Unfortunately, after many conversations with different companies, the average would be \$300 per student with a minimum of 40 students needed to sign up for this service to be available. We understand that price tag is not reasonable for the majority of our students, and therefore we are not offering campus-sanctioned storage through a company. Instead, we recommend getting a group of friends together and reaching out to local storage facilities, renting a large storage unit, and splitting the cost. The cost will be different depending on the size of your unit and how many people split the cost. Local storage facilities include Bennington self-storage, Shaftsbury selfstorage (802-375-9028), and AVS self-storage. For our students who need someone to move belongings for them, we recommend All Seasons Movers (802-375-9028). We are unable to offer on-campus storage to the majority of our students due to the use of our campus by other programs over the summer, however, we will have the Bingham basement available to our international students. Depending on how many international students need this option, we may be able to expand this storage to our FLoW students living 500 miles or more away. Please contact the Office of Student Life about storage if you are an international student in need of summer storage by May 1.

What image can you create with the theme of "Belonging and Community" for the fall orientation and first-year experience?


