FROM THE HEALTH SERVICE

The Chest X-ray Clinic will be held on Wednesday and Thursday, October 18th and 19th, beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday.

Any student with a positive reaction to her T.B. skin test should sign for a chest x-ray unless she has had one since January, 1950, and has arranged to have the report sent to the college. Also, any member of the community may have a chest x-ray by making an appointment in the Health Service. If you are a student and have never before had a chest x-ray at the college, this service will cost you nothing. There is a \$1.00 charge for all others, except college employees who handle food.

Failure to have an x-ray at this Clinic will not excuse a student from having a chest x-ray which will probably cost from \$10.00 to \$15.00 at any other place or time.

There will be a nurse on duty, as usual, all during Mid-Term Vacation. In case of emergency, the nurse can be reached by dialing 255 or calling the Switchboard Operator.

The hours for the dispensary during Mid-Term Vacation will be from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.
