

CENTRAL COMMITTEE REPORT-1941-42

This year it seemed necessary for the Central Committee to change some of its mechanism before the general reorganization plan came into effect. In order to speed up our routine jobs and to eliminate waste steps we have limited the membership to the chairman and secretary of the Central Committee, the director of personnel, Mrs. Garrett, and her secretary, Miss Johnson. We, also, followed the suggestion of the last year's Central Committee that the chairman and secretary alternate in the performance of their duties. This was considered a satisfactory arrangement and has been written into the general reorganization plan.

A few changes were made in parking regulations, requirements for driving tests, and the routine of licensing. It also was found necessary to redefine certain standards concerning men in student houses.

It might be of interest to the community to know about some of the other activities of the Central Committee. During 1941-42 we issued 42 college driver's licenses and acted upon 37 cases of early vacation leave and late return. During this term it was necessary to call 22 girls before the Central Committee. The majority of these offenses occurred during the spring term.

The contact of this committee with the students has been its most important work; its greatest concern and interest. The Central Committee has attempted to clarify existing policies and to educate people to the standards. This perhaps will continue to be the aim of the new Central Committee.
