

### Dean X-change

In the Fall of 2014, students suggested that the college consider divesting from fossil fuel companies. The Investment Committee of the Bennington Board of Trustees which oversees the funds invested in the College's endowment, took this into account in the selection of the new endowment manager: Glenmede. The Committee has decided to pursue the topic of Socially Responsible Investing (SRI)—the concept of aligning your investments with your values—in its investment practices. The College is seeking to educate and receive input from the entire College community on this important subject. You are invited to attend an SRI open forum session on May 16, which will be facilitated by representatives from Glenmede.—there will be three sessions in the CAPA Symposium at 10:00 am, 1:00 pm, and 3:00 pm. Glenmede will provide information on the topic at the beginning of each session, then open the floor for discussion and comments.
