The term just began, and it is already clear that there is tension among the student body, the student government, and the administration. If the faculty sets a precedent by choosing not to vote on the issue of hours for men in rooms, then there are two constituencies who remain involved in domestic policy - the administration and the student body.

The first of this galley is to reaffirm that the members of Leg, Judicial, and Exec are elected by the student body, to represent the student body. They are not liasons between the administration and the student body. They are limited by the constitution.

It should also be clear by this time that if the student representatives do not act as representatives of the students, and if the student body is not a united political group, there will be increased dictation of policy by the administration and the president.

The second purpose of this galley is to remind the president and the administration that Leg, Exec and Judicial, in particular, are elected by the student body for specific purposes given in the constitution. They are not liasons nor should they be the instruments of administrative or presidential policy or duty.
