 <u>the CoVerified app</u> from the iOS App Store. Otherwise, in a web browser,
 navigate to the <u>CoVerified login page</u>. Review the <u>App tutorial</u>.
- Login to Coverified using your Bennington email address. This is true for both the app and the web site.
- When you are redirected to the single-sign on page, login with your Bennington credentials, just as you would login to your email account.
- You are now logged into CoVerified.
- Bookmark the <u>CoVerified login instructions</u> so you can refer to them as needed.
