

Year in Review

The gate count recording people entering the library was 107,175; the total circulation 34,733; there were 921 reference interactions and 1,589 acquisition requests from faculty and students. The annual average of books checked out per student was 18.

There were 14 library instruction sessions with 177 students. Some sessions took place in the library, others in classrooms; topics varied from broad overviews of resources to very specific research questions. The average rating for the sessions was 4.6 (1 = poor and 5 = excellent).

Students rated the effectiveness of the librarian teaching in terms of organization and clarity of

presentation, the overall value of the library instruction class session, and the relevance of the information presented to the research assignment.

In August 2010 Jared Della Rocca joined the library staff as the outreach and technology services librarian.

The library continues to solicit input about services and the collection from students. A student focus group was held during the fall and a new student advisory library panel was formed during the spring term.

Seniors working on a thesis or project had the opportunity to reserve a personal shelf in the library. Each reserved shelf had a plate labeled with the student's name and research topic. The plates were given to the students at the end of the year.

The Collection

Collaborative collection development continues to be a top priority for the library. We received 1,589 acquisition requests from faculty and students (862 faculty, 727 students) representing 58% of all purchased acquisitions for the year.

The children's picture book and literature collection was moved to the lower level to increase the visibility and appeal of the collection. This change was made based on feedback from a student focus group.

The library continues to promote books and reading through displays, the web site and reading lists. For the fifth consecutive year the faculty provided reading recommendations for Field Work

Term reading. The library also had <u>readings lists</u> from artist Steve Lambert and writer Aimee Bender.

The library added Early English Books Online, commonly referred to as EEBO, to its collection of electronic resources. It contains digital facsimile page images of virtually every work printed in England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and British North America and works in English printed elsewhere from 1473-1700 from the first book printed in English by William Caxton, through the age of Spenser & Shakespeare. The library also expanded its holdings in the JSTOR database by adding the Arts & Sciences VII collection.



The Building

During January and February of 2011 the library closed so construction work could be done on the main floor. The transformative renovation resulted in a more attractive and functional main floor and entrance. A beautiful architect-designed, custom-built desk was installed on the main floor. The old brown carpeting was replaced with a beautiful new cork floor. The old linoleum in the foyer was replaced with slate tiles and an updated security gate was installed.

Select Events & Exhibitions

Jubilee Library Series was created by students in the "Community Arts and Public Libraries" tutorial. The students produced a series of four thematic public events about Food, Read & Writing, Listening, and Making. The series was supported by Crossett Library and held at the McCullough Free Library, North Bennington.

Free Speech Forum a new lunch time discussion group was hosted by

librarian Jared Della Rocca. The topic for the spring term was WikiLeaks. Jared also hosted a popular Trivia Night held weekly in the Student Center.



Ex Libris: Bookplates from Crossett was an exhibition held in September featuring beautiful bookplates in books that the library owns.

Vermont Reads 2011, a statewide One-Book Community Reading Program, chose Harper Lee's *To Kill a Mockingbird* as this year's selection. In collaboration with Southern Vermont College and the McCullough Free Library, North Bennington, Crossett Library hosted and participated in a variety of programming related to this Vermont Humanities Council program.
