Students are reminded that the T.B. Clinic will be held on TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20TH, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. They will be able to x-ray from 25-30 people an hour, and we are especially eager to have most people report as early in the day as possible, and to remind their friends also.

If you do not know whether or not you should have an x-ray, your House Chairman has a list or you can check with the list on the Bulletin Board in the Health Service. If you will make sure whether or not you need an x-ray then you will save time on Tuesday, October 20th.

In addition to those who have to have an x-ray, Faculty, Staff and employees may take advantage of the clinic.
