MOVIE, "KAMERADSCHAFT"

"Kameradschaft", directed by the well-known G. W. Pabst, is an important sound film, photographed in the realist tradition. The actual story was suggested by a true mine disaster on the Franco-German border; however, the sets are largely studio-made. The photography and the handling of the actors give such a true-to-life impression that one can almost consider this documentary. Pabst is famous for such films as Joyless Street, Love of Jeanne Ney, and Westfront (1918). Dialogue is in German with considerable French. Subtitles are in English.

CHILDREN'S AND JUNIORS DANCE CLASSES

Children's and Juniors dance classes at Bennington College will begin on Saturday, October 4th, and continue through Saturday, December 20th. This series of twelve Saturday morning classes will mark the third year of the children's group. Emphasis in training is on basic rhythm, movement in the free form of the modern dance, development of musical awareness, and those fundamentals of ballet suitable to such work. This year, there will be particular stress upon improvisation and creative work, and on individual instruction. Two assistants will be present for this latter purpose.

There will be a slight change in the hours and age divisions of the classes. Five through eight year olds will meet from ten to eleven, and nine through fourteen year olds from eleven thirty to one. The price will be seventy-five cents (\$ .75) for the first group and one dollar (\$1.00) for the second group. The fee this year will not be paid in a

total sum, but in accordance with attendance.

Suzanne Kaplan is again in charge of the classes, and parents who are interested may telephone her at Bennington 5401 any evening between 6:30 and 8:00.
