About the Artists.....

Geremy Schulick and Brett Parnell began playing as a guitar duo when they first met in the fall of 2003 as students in the Master of Music program at the Yale School of Music. They currently study with Benjamin Verdery, who frequently refers to them as "The worst guitar duo in the world," and is quoted as saying, "They are the worst guitar duo in the world." Geremy and Brett both began playing guitar in their early teenage years, when their eclectic and highly varied repertoire ranged from Led Zeppelin to Ozzy Ozzborne, and started dedicating their studies to classical guitar upon entering college. Geremy graduated from Bennington College in his home state of Vermont (admits he has hugged trees), where he studied with Frederic Hand. Brett graduated from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro in his home state of North Carolina (frequently begs Geremy to play dueling banjos with him, but Geremy gets too weirded out) where he studied with Mark Mazzatenta.
