Report from the Health Committee to Mr. Jones on a plan for changing the location of the infirmary.

It is felt by us and we believe throughout the community, feel

that the infirmary is not adequate. By this we do not mean

that the staff or equipment are lacking, but that the location
and cramped quarters of the present infirmary are not condugive to the best possible care of which we are capable of
rendering. The main objections to our present infirmary are lambur, but that it is one of the noisier spots on campus (dishwashing, people passing and talking all the time). It can

not take care of an epidemic (not enough room, isolation
difficult), .3/ the comfort is not great enough so that the

people who are sick will come in before they are sick enough
to have done considerable damage by spreading their infections.

we have investigated the various buildings on campus with the idea that we might possibly find one which with a limited amount of remodelling, would make a good permanent infirmary. In looking we have taken into consideration the facts that if it must be close enough so that we can have the dispensary at the same place, I and that it must have the factors which we find lacking in the present infirmary. Cricket Hill, which is at present used for the nursery school and for housing guests plus a few of the staff, seems to fill perfectly our needs. On the plan on page I may be seen the way in which we would use the space, and the few things which we would want done. If we were to take over Cricket Will various difficulties would arise. 1/ How would we solve the food problem? We would propose that the prepared food be brought up and cooked by the maid, as is now done in the nursery school. 2/ What would we do with the guests and the staff living there at present? When we leave the infirmary we leave a good amount of floor space, which would include not only the infirmary but Dr. Chassell's office. This space with some left over could easily make up the guest suites. The staff would be moved to an appartment building, which has not been built, but which has already been planned for that purpose. The nursery school would be moved to the chicken coop, which is at present used for crama practice rooms. The drama division would either use some of the floor space left from the infirmary or they might use some space in the North Suites, particularly if some of the offices were moved down to the infirmary. We realize that in planning this someone somewhere is getting the bad end of the bargain. This is obviously the drama division. However, at some later date Fairview is going to be extended to accomodate them, so that being put out of their practice rooms would not be a permanent inconvenience. Actually there are other possibilities such as moving the nursery school somewhere else.

We feel that the infirmary is a very important part of the college, and that it has not been treated as such. Its' existing conditions are not in accord with the standard of

extreme comfort, which has been pla followed when planning

other parts of the college, We hope that you will consider

this plan as a possibility when the next changes are made.
