
## Faculty Music Concert

One of the most renowned American artists, Frankenthaler has received numerous awards including the 2001 National Medal of Arts for her lifetime achievement, the Philadelphia Academy Medal of Honor, and induction into the Connecticut Women's Hall of Fame, among other countless honors. She has had several one-woman exhibitions, including retrospectives at the Museum of Modern Art, the National Gallery of Art, and the Whitney Museum of American Art, with her work included in virtually every major art museum collection in America.


