That is David Hoeh speaking. He was Senator McCarthy's campaign manager in the New Hampshire primary. He was chairman of the New Hampshire delegation, and was arrested when he tried to expose Mayor Daley's method of packing the galleries. Now he's running for Congress in New Hampshire. He's running for the new politics—and he needs your help.

His opponent, the incumbent, Congressman Cleveland, has consistently supported and voted for President Johnson's Vietnam policy, and has said of those who oppose that policy, "They disgrace the causes of dissent and aid and abet the enemy that we fight." (Congressional Record, Nov. 20, 1967)

This is the critical point in the campaign. Canvassers are badly needed in Hanover. Transportation is provided, but they should bring their own food.
