## Center for the Advancement of Public Action (CAPA) to Host Immigration Detention Conference

**Bennington, VT:** Bennington College's Center for the Advancement of Public Action (CAPA) will host its annual <u>Incarceration in America conference</u> from **May 11 - 12** around the topic of immigration detention. All events are free, open to the public, and will take place in the CAPA Symposium on Bennington's campus. <u>Registration</u> is requested by **May 3**.

The conference begins on **Friday, May 11 at 7 PM** with a keynote address given by **Catherine Tactaquin**, executive director of the National Network for Immigrant and Refugee Rights.

On Saturday, May 12 from 10:00 - 11:30 AM, Julián Lazalde, civic engagement & policy analyst for the National Immigrant Justice Center, will moderate a panel on General Trends in Immigration Enforcement. He is joined by John Amaya and Daniel Ragsdale, who were part of the Department of Homeland Security under President Obama's administration; Scott Clark from ACLU Immigrant Protection Project of Western MA; and Lauren Kostes from The Florence Project.

From 11:45 AM - 1:15 PM, Khalil Cumberbatch, associate vice president of policy at The Fortune Society, will moderate a panel on Immigration Detention and Private Prisons. He is joined by Devora Gonzalez from School of the Americas Watch, Lauren Kostes from The Florence Project, and Kent Mendoza from the Anti-Recidivism Coalition.

From 2:00 - 3:30 PM, Catherine Tactaquin will moderate a panel on Local Government and NGO Involvement. She is joined by Devora Gonzalez, Jessica Hanson from the National Immigration Law Center, Julián Lazalde from the National Immigrant Justice Center, and Corey Lazar from Vera Institute of Justice.

## About the Incarceration in America Initiative

The United States has the highest documented rate of incarceration in the world, which reached its peak in 2007 and has been gradually declining since. To continue and accelerate this trend, Bennington College launched the Incarceration in America initiative, which partners with distinguished advocates and providers to offer course curriculum, visiting speakers, theatrical events, think tanks, and conferences focused on developing public policy and political action in the post-tough-on-crime era.

Since the inception of the Incarceration in America initiative in 2014, CAPA has partnered with many organizations doing important work in this field, including JustLeadershipUSA, The Fortune Society, Brooklyn Community Bail Fund, and Housing Plus Solutions. Through this initiative, CAPA has addressed topics as far-reaching as higher education in prisons, the aging incarcerated population, women in prison, how to redefine justice and effect change, immigrant detention and deportation, and alternatives to incarceration.
