Supplementary report.

Conference with Nancy Martin

Nancy had been reported for having men in the living room for much longer than an hour and also for disorderly conduct after the formal dance. Phyllis Carton thought it wise to speak to Nancy and see if there was misunderstanding involved rather than merely sending her routine reminders. The origin and purpose of the standards were explained and discussed. Nancy was most cooperative and understanding as soon as the function of central committee was clarified. There have been no unfavorable reports since this time.

At a similar conference with Sara Hollmeyer, who had also repeatedly broken the standard concerning men in living rooms, it was discovered that she too had been unclear about the procedures and values involved. Sara was very responsible and appreciative in her attitude toward the discussion.

Note for future reference concerning explanation of standards.

It is recommended that the job of acquainting new students with standards be very carefully undertaken. The committee has noted that many freshman were unclear about the standards to begin with and this explains in large part their irresponsibility.
