

Talk to Community Council

May 20, 1941

I think this is a very good time for the community council to have a wash day. We might do a little self analyzing. We are a young council, 1 freshman, 10 sophomore, and 1 junior. Not that I think this need be a depressing fact or necessarily a hindrance, but I think it wise that we become doubly conscious of the responsibility we have assumed. Our main function as members of the community council is to be a tie between the community and the council. This is not an easy job, but if each one of us is conscious of the fact and acts accordingly the council and the central committee should be able to act with some proficiency.

To really act as a tie between the community and the council and central committee each one of us must report the various things that come to our attention during the week. This doesn't mean that we must become a snooping body but it does demand that each of us assume the responsibility of reporting the things that should be reported.
