Subject: Summer Residence on Campus

A limited exception will be made this year to the College policy of discouraging student residence and use of facilities during the summer. This exception is being made specifically for the purpose of enabling two groups of students to remain on campus, the first of them to engage in a study of the College and the second to engage in a community action project.

The group to study the College, a follow-up of our "Day of Self-Study," will be made up of four students and it will inquire into our educational philosophy, our curriculum, our community government and our social life. The other group of students, a maximum of six in number, will inquire into and initiate community action projects in the local community. The College study group will be expected to write a report for the College community to be presented in the fall. The community action group will be expected to make its experience available in the fall to the faculty and students involved in the recently approved experimental community action course.

The students involved in these two projects will be expected to spend 8 weeks on campus, living in the ground floor of one of the new student houses. They will be responsible for maintenance of their own living quarters and for the preparation of their own food. The College will pay the cost of room and board and a stipend of \$20 a week. (In a few instances, federal work/study grants may be available in lieu of room and board and the College stipend.)

Students interested in either of these two projects should make written application to the Director of the Non-Resident Term not later than Friday, June 7. The application should consist of the student's name, a brief statement of the background of experience, if any, which would qualify him or her for the project and a brief statement of what educational significance the project could be expected to yield in terms of the applicant's educational plans. A committee yet to be determined will advise the President on the selection of both of these groups.
