I. I. RABI, ATOM PHYSICIST,  
SPEAKS AT COLLEGE MAY 16

On Monday May 16 the College community and interested local residents will have the opportunity to hear Dr. I. I. Rabi, now head of the physics department at Columbia University, speak on the subject "Academic Research".

Dr. Rabi is numbered among America's leading physicists. He received the Nobel Prize in 1944 for his work in atomic physics, and is at present a member of the General Advisory Committee for the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission.

Dr. Rabi's address will be given in the Carriage Barn, at 7:40 p.m.

A graduate of the NYU School of Law, Mr. Kampelman received an M.A. degree at the University of Minnesota, where he taught before joining the Bennington faculty.

Mr. Kampelman was vice-chairman of the Mayor's Committee on Charter Reform, when Sen. Humphrey was mayor of Minneapolis.

SHAPIRO'S PRINTS, DRAWINGS,

On display on the third floor of Commons are prints, drawings, and designs by Daniel Shapiro, of the art faculty. This exhibition will continue through May 15, and presents recent work as well as several earlier pieces.
