Jesse Katz has been a journalist for the better part of three decades. He shared in two Pulitzer Prizes as a staff writer at the Los Angeles Times and was a Pulitzer finalist for his coverage of street gangs. As a senior writer at Los Angeles magazine he received numerous awards, including PEN USA's literary journalism award, the James Beard Foundation's M.F.K. Fisher Distinguished Writing Award, and four City and Regional Magazine Association gold medals. His articles have been reprinted in The Best American Magazine Writing and The Best American Crime Writing and he has contributed to The New York Times Magazine, Details, Rolling Stone, Texas Monthly, and Food & Wine.

Katz will read from *The Opposite Field*, his newly released memoir of raising a son and reviving a Little League in the immigrant suburbs of Eastside Los Angeles.
