# Drinking in the Carriage Bern:

At present the same Community Standard applies to the Carriage Barn as to the Gollege dining room and the student lounge. It has been suggested that the Carriage Barn be given the same status as the student living rooms. It was unanimously voted to accept this suggestion with the recommendation that reservations for the Carriage Barn which include people outside the community be published in the Gollege Week and students be encouraged to consider their behavior at these times from the public relations viewpoint.

### Delegates to Conferences:
