From Hildegard Peplau R. N. Re: Glassware in kitchen and dining rooms.

I realize that the Health Committee is dealing with the problem.

However, I think that the glassware that has been exploding ad lib
during the past year must not be used. The college could be sued
for a considerable sum for the loss of an eye if a sliver penetrates
the eyeball of a student. The Insurance company would be very irate,
I am sure, if they knew that the proper precautions for employee safety
were disregarded. Complaints about this hazard to community safety have
been numerous, accidents have continued to happen and the glassware is
still in use. The employee injured this morning was indeed fortunate that
the sliver of glass embedded itself in the mucous fold rather than in the
eyeball. The many student who have been showered with glass, both from
drinking glasses and soup dishes, were fortunate to have escaped so lightly.
Eyes cannot be replaced. The measure of safety we offer at Bennington College
could certainly be increased if we considered such items a personal responsibility.

I sound upset, I am. I should hate to be called upon to treat a student with a sliver of glass embedded in an eyeball. The incident this morning comes closer to this possibility than is good for my mental comfort.
