Community Meeting

Dr. Marcus took his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Columbia University. He has worked with Dr. S. J. Thackeray on a translation of Josephus completing the sixth volume alone. He has also published a treatise on Law in the Apocrypha. Dr. Marcus is now Professor of Semitic Philology at the Jewish Institute of Religion, and lecturer in Semitic Languages at Columbia University.

The Baroness Hilla von Rebay was born in Strasburg and studied in Dusseldorf, Paris and Munich. Her paintings were exhibited in Germany and France before and during the last war. She was a member of the "November Gruppe" in 1918 and in 1920 a member of the "Kraeter." Other exhibits were held in Paris from 1932 to 1938. "Her work developed since 1914 from Academicism through Impressionism, Expressionism and Cubism to Non-objective paintings. Like Klee her work is mostly lyrical chamber music." She has been Curator of the Guggenheim Foundation since 1937.

The film Experimental Studies in the Social Climate of Groups, by Kurt Lewin, Ronald Lippitt and Ralph White of the Iowa Child Welfare Research Station, has two parts. Part 1 compares groups of children in autocratic democratic and laissez-faire atmospheres. Part 2 shows the same children in the transition from one atmosphere to another. The behavior typical of each atmosphere may be seen: the two basic reactions to autocracy, apathy and aggression; the horseplay and boredom that developed in the
