She served as Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere, Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and part of President Obama's Science Team (2009-2013), and later as the first Science Envoy for the Ocean, with the State Department (2014-2016). She received her B.A. from Colorado College, M.S. from the University of Washington and PhD in ecology from Harvard University. She has been on the faculty at Harvard and Oregon State University.
