

Dances made for special natural or man-made environments. These can be churches, museums, gardens, colleges, parks, beaches, mountains, theatre spaces and factories. Each composition is made specifically for each site and may be performed at different times of the day. Each dance is video-taped, photographed and written about in essay or poetry form. The audience experiences the journey to the site, the climate, and the unique environment.

Site Dances may involve dancers, musicians, artists, lighting, set and costume designers, and videographers. A particular dance may involve one solo performer or a dozen professional collaborators. Another might include an entire community of volunteer participants. Costumes and sets are found or recycled objects whenever possible.
