On Thursday, September 23, in the Carriage Barn, a piano recital will be given by Stell Andersen. Miss Andersen, who has spent much of her time in North Bennington for a number of years, graduated with highest honors from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago. She has appeared as soloist with the New York Philharmonic and with the Symphony Orchestras of Detroit, Boston, New Orleans, Paris, Warsaw, and Amsterdam. At the Paris Exhibition in 1937, she was the only American soloist to appear.

FROM THE HEALTH SERVICE

In accordance with the tuberculosis case-finding program carried out in most college institutions, we will start skin testing this week on all new students and all students who have had a previous negative skin test, and continue testing during Dispensary hours until all are finished. If no redness appears following this test, nothing more is done this year. We are using a new material that requires only the one test, but it is absolutely necessary that you report 3 days after the test to have the reaction observed. If, however, you have a positive reaction to the skin test, X-ray is indicated when we hold our annual X-ray Clinic in cooperation with the State Tuberculosis Association here at the college on October 13th.

Each new student will receive an X-ray regardless of her skin test unless she has reported having one in the last year. This is because occasionally something else shows up other than tuberculosis and it is well to have an X-ray for future reference or comparison.

There is a one-dollar charge for chest X-rays for all students except those who have just had a positive skin test for the first time.

Your cooperative is requested in coming promptly for your skin test as we anticipate over 300 tests and this work must be done by early October. There is quite an interval between the date of the X-ray clinic and the time when we receive reports. We do like to get these reports to the students before the end of the semester.
