III. KINUTA ("THE SILK BOARD") a "Noh" play, translated from the Japanese by Ernest Fenollosa and Ezra Pound.

The Pound-Fenollosa collection has been an important influence on modern poetic drama, by way of Yeats's "Plays for Dancers" and Obey's "Lucrece".

The plot of the play is as follows: The Waki, a country gentleman, has tarried long in the capital. At last he sends his maid home with a message to his wife. The maid journeys home, poling down a stream and talking as she goes, while the wife complains.

The chorus sings of separation and the passage of time, while the wife and the maid beat the silk board. The husband starts for home, poling down the river.

The wife dies, and the husband arrives too late.

The chorus sings a death song, while the ghost of the wife calls to them. The ghost of the wife --- now "enlightened", and freed from her earthly attachments --- appears to the chorus, the maid and the husband.
