FROM THE HEALTH SERVICE

Will students who have had illnesses, operations, accidents and other interesting medical experiences please report these items to the Health Service? We are particularly interested in those who may have had infectious mononucleosis subsequent to the closing of College or later.

There is considerable talk about flu. The Health Service will again offer flu shots to those who want them. One shot, \$1.25--no protection for the first two weeks--probable duration of protection, six months. Advantages -- decrease in the chance of contracting flu with not only the few days of acute illness but also the long drawn out convalescence and possible complications.
