
The January 6 Project

Rabbi Michael Cohen has been appointed to the Partnership for Peace Fund advisory board, as a result of the <u>Nita M. Lowey Middle East Partnership for Peace Act</u> (MEPPA). MEPPA will deliver \$250 million over five years to projects that support peacebuilding and Palestinian economic development, and represents the largest investment ever in the region's peacebuilders.
