#### **Brave Little State**

As you may know, Vermont Public Radio was on campus in December to interview Bennington faculty, staff, and students as part of their ongoing higher education coverage. <a href="VPR's interview">VPR's interview</a> with Isabel Roche aired as part of an episode of its Brave Little State podcast, which discussed the financial and demographic challenges facing higher education and the ways in which Vermont colleges are responding. <a href="Art for Access">Art for Access</a> and the College's <a href="partnership with Middlebury">partnership with Middlebury</a> Language Schools were cited as strategic examples of innovative fundraising.

#### **Barn Challenge**

A special fundraising effort is taking place from now until June 30 for the rebuilding of the Barn. Two generous alumnae trustees, Penelope Perkins Wilson '45 and Charlene Solow Schwartz '54, have pledged \$900,000 for the Barn Challenge: a one-time fundraising effort for the Barn's restoration in which all donations will be matched 1:1, up to \$900,000.
