What happens if I lose my Bennington Card/Student ID?

To replace a lost or stolen card, please come to the Office of Student Life during open hours (posted on the back of College Week).

Where Can I Use My Bennington Card?

The Bennington Card - the official ID card of the Bennington Community provide students access to a variety of places, including:

The Dining Hall, Library, MRB (general admission and use it to pay for classes), and laundry facilities. The Card can also be used like a debit card on campus and will also allow students to add money to their cards on a declining balance to be used at the Snack Bar and Bookstore, and to pay for Student Life-sponsored trips and events.
