Friday, October 12: FWT Public Action, Entrepreneurial Venture, and Lortel Theatre Fellowship applications due on Handshake (returning students only, includes grant applications)

Friday, November 9: FWT registrations due on Handshake (no extended due date)

Friday, December 14: Last day to add or change an FWT position

Tech Tip of the Week

One of the most valuable tools on your Mac or PC is its screenshot tool. Whether you are sending an error message to IT@Bennington or just a snippet from a spreadsheet to a colleague in the Business Office, the screenshot tool can help make you more efficient.

- On Macs, CMD Shift 3 takes a photo of the entire screen, or you can press the Print Screen button on your Windows keyboard for PCs, and the screenshot can be pasted into any photo-editing software, like Paint or Photoshop. Screenshots from your Mac save to your desktop as a .pnq.
- On Macs, CMD Shift 4 lets you use your mouse and select a portion of your screen to take a screenshot of. On the PC, you can use the Snipping Tool a program in Windows to select a specific area of your screen to take a screenshot.
